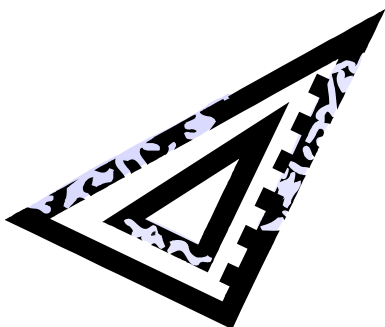

About the Presenters

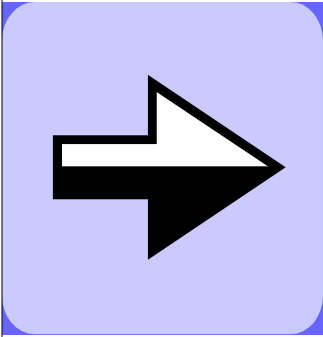
Lieutenant Kevin Dillon (Ret)

Lieutenant Kevin Dillon (Ret) is founder and president of KFD Training and Consultation LLC. 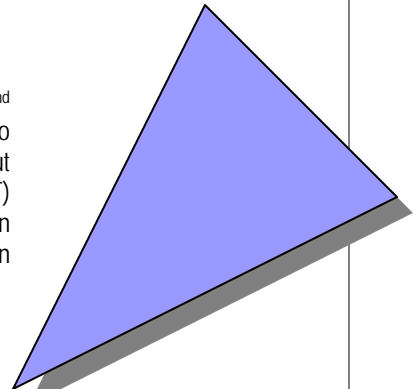


Sergeant Daniel Cruz

Sergeant Daniel Cruz has over 12 years of law enforcement experience. He began his career with the State of Connecticut in 1994 as a Police Officer for the Department of Children and Families (DCF) Connecticut Juvenile Justice Training Center. Sergeant Cruz began extensive training in control and restraint techniques and became an instructor, training DCF staff and Police Officers for the Connecticut Juvenile Justice Training Center. In 1999, Sergeant Cruz transferred to the University of Connecticut Police Department in Storrs CT. While assigned to the Patrol division, Sgt. Cruz became a state certified law enforcement instructor and is an adjunct instructor for the Police Academy in Meriden, CT. Sgt. Cruz also has a Martial Arts background and a 2nd degree Black Belt in the L.O.C.K.U.P. Police Combat System. He is also an instructor for a newly developed program called, Police Combat Fitness.

In 2003, Sgt. Cruz was reassigned to the University of Connecticut Waterbury Substation, where he is currently the

Supervising Sergeant assigned to 2nd shift. In 2004, Sgt. Cruz was accepted to the City of Waterbury, Connecticut Emergency Response Team (SWAT) and became the first officer in UConn Police Department history to serve in that capacity.
